Early Childhood

Happy New Year from Early Childhood! Welcome back from what we hope was a very blessed,

preparations for the coming of that special baby, Jesus. The children were so excited to revisit the story of Jesus' birth and were happy to learn that "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6. The children were busy all month long, making ornaments and decorations for your home that we are sure you will cherish for years. We had an awesome time worshiping Jesus together and practicing and performing Christmas songs for you. It was a successful Christmas concert, and we all had a great time.



In addition to all our Christmas preparations, the children continued finishing up learning about the three continents, Asia, Europe, and the Polar region from our Continent study. In our Geography studies, we discuss and explore the Land, Air, and Water, Montessori hands-on activities that teach children about the interconnectedness of the three essential components of our environments. By learning about these elements in a hands-on way children develop a deeper understanding and appreciation for the natural world around them. Through exploration and observation, they begin to understand the interdependence of land, air, and water, and how vital it is to protect and preserve their resources for future generations.

For January, the children observe their classrooms, materials, and lessons that we are in winter theme, and with that, for cultural studies, we continued our study with the polar region, Antarctica. We explore and learn about land and water forms. We observed and studied the topic of air -wind, weather, climate, and clouds. This coming month, February, for our cultural studies we are going to study earth's rotation and day/night, Earth's revolution, and seasons.

"The child has a different relation to his environment from ours...The child absorbs it. The things he sees are not just remembered; they form part of his soul. He incarnates in himself all in the world about him that his eye sees, and his ears hear." Maria Montessori (The Absorbent Mind)

Here are some friendly reminders:

• A child who is not feeling well or has obvious symptoms of illness should not be brought to school. Requesting that the child be kept from outdoor play at school is not an acceptable solution.

A child, who is not well enough to go out during our regular outside times, is not well enough to attend school. Please notify the school if your child is ill by calling or emailing the office.

• Parents will need to keep children home when they are sick or symptomatic. This includes: temperature of 100.4F or greater, sore throat, new uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline), diarrhea, vomiting, and abdominal pain, new onset or severe headache, or excessive fatigue. Children and staff who come to school sick will be sent home as soon as possible.

Lower Elementary

Greetings from Lower Elementary!

Sweet Pea and Lilac classes have settled in after enjoying a wonderful Christmas break!

Cultural studies in LE are in full swing and students have been enjoying History, Physical Geography, and Botany every week. LE students just finished a money unit in History in which they studied different coins, and practiced skills such as making change in story problems. Coming up, Lower Elementary is looking forward to starting the Timeline of the Eras of Life and exploring different historical time periods.

In Physical Geography, students have explored various experiments that illustrate the natural world around them. A few favorite experiments have included making rain in a jar which demonstrates the water cycle as well as making a model iceberg to accompany our study of the hydrosphere. Looking ahead, Lower Elementary will be starting Cultural Geography which includes continent studies, specifically Australia and Africa this spring.

Botany is always a favorite of Lower Elementary students! In Botany, students have been exploring an overview of the parts of plants and their functions such as the stems, roots, leaves, and leaf venation. Looking ahead, Lower Elementary will be exploring animal adaptations in Zoology that coincide with our continent studies of Australia and Africa.

Hello, GMA parents!

Happy February! With the holiday season behind us, we are now back into the swing of things after a blessed Christmas break.

This month is quieter, with just a few things headed our way. As you know, Valentine's Day is coming up. We will be having a class party in the afternoon. We ask that students bring a shoebox-sized box to decorate as their Valentine's mailbox by Monday, February 12th. We will also be sending out communication regarding treats for the party.

We are switching gears in language this month. The wonderful thing about Montessori is our capacity to modify the lesson plans based on the students' needs. We have been spending the past few weeks focusing on sentence structure and are wrapping up with direct objects. After evaluating the students' progress in this area, we have decided to switch gears for development of grammar fundamentals.

We have been working very hard in math on our multiplication facts since the new year started. I would love it if you could support our efforts at home with some multiplication flashcards. If you need a set, I have some available. Just email me, and I will send them home with your kiddo. Most of our math groups have been working diligently on long division either abstractly or with materials. Our higher group has been digging deep into fractions.

In Geometry, 4th graders have most recently been working on Perimeter and we will be moving into area here soon. 5th and 6th graders have learned how to find the area of figures such as rectangles, parallelograms, triangles, and trapezoids. We will soon be exploring how to find the area of all regular polygons.

This year in science, we are delving into matter and energy. It has been so much fun recently as we have been building molecules and compounds with clay/Play Doh. We will soon be learning about acid and bases along with density fire and combustion, and energy sources.

We are also navigating our Peacemaker curriculum. Students have learned about the "Slippery Slope of Conflict." We are encouraging students to exercise the "talk-it-out" method of conflict instead of going the "attack" or "escape" route. It has been valuable for students to have a reference point when conflict arises, so that they can aim to resolve conflict in the way that has been illustrated for them and in a way that glorifies God.

We also want to welcome Steph Smith as our chapel teacher. Each week, students learn about different Biblical Truths. Last week, they were introduced to Isaiah 59:2, which states that sin separates us from God. It has been amazing to see how Ms. Smith engages the students and immerses them in the Word.

As always, we thank you for your continued support and are looking forward to a great rest of the school year here in Absaroka!

It is the norm that Montessori pre-schools and elementaries do not assign grades. We are working towards the concept of mastery – you work at something until you have mastered it! In traditional education, time is the constant and learning is the variable. In Montessori education, time is the variable and learning is the constant.

remember very well being disappointed. Does simply passing a class really fuel our drive for excellence? Good enough is just good enough? Whereas in Montessori education, good enough is only good enough WHEN it is good enough, which is mastery. To exert ourselves to the highest level possible leads to us feeling accomplished, confident, and satisfied. This allows our students to focus on achievement and excellence.

In addition, traditional education doesn't take into account students' interests as they teach the same thing at the same time, nor are all of the students ready for the same work in the same class.

There is growing research that confirms the significant role that choice plays in a student's motivation and learning, and even crucial to their development. Through the ability to choose their own work and work at their own pace in a Montessori environment, children are truly motivated. It kindles their nature desire to learn...until mastery!
